

BCSA/CPS CHILD PROTECTION TRAINING MODEL AND OVERALL STRATEGY:

The Child Protection Solutions/BCSA Child Protection training model underwent a full review in early 2019 and now consists of a streamlined customised intensive training strategy which was presented to, and ratified by the BCSA Assembly Board on February 3, 2019,

The new strategy replaces the previous SA Government 7-hour Child Safe Environments (CSE) program, which for BCSA churches included additional customised CPS modules not included in the standard CSE program. The former SA Government CSE program has now been replaced with the new SA Governments “Through Their Eyes” program. (TTE)

Whilst CPS presenters are accredited SA Government “Through Their Eyes” trainers, as the Director of Professional Standards for BCSA, I advised the State Executive Minister in January 2019 that the new 7 hour TTE program lacked important content, and on multiple levels fell short of the recommended CPS/BCSA standard of training. Unlike previous years CPS obtained approval to include additional specialist modules in the CSE program, however the new TTE program no longer has provision for this to occur to the required and or acceptable levels.

For those who have previously obtained and hold a current CSE or now TTE (or RAN) certificate (Refer to via outside providers please refer to the “Acceptable Training to BCSA” box for specific information.

BCSA STANDARD & PREFERRED LEVEL OF TRAINING:

6 Hour Customised Intensive:

Understanding and Responding to Child Abuse and Sexual Exploitation

This seminar includes additional Child Sex Offender Awareness Modules designed to: “Make Young People and the Church Safe”

3 Hour Update Intensive – Upon completion of the 6 hour seminar, 3 hour update sessions are required every three years in order to maintain BCSA standards.

No person without proper screening, a current criminal history check, and undertaking the BCSA level of training should operate at any level within children’s/youth ministry programs. To do so would be in breach of BCSA, legislative and insurance standards/requirements.

It is important to note that the CPS/BCSA training model is strategically designed and forms just one component of an overall comprehensive support and prevention strategy which includes:

- • Unlimited “on-tap” child protection & professional standards consultancy and support to churches. (Including 24/7 crisis response consultancy)
- • The design and presentation of a range of additional professional standards and child protection seminars presented at intermediate through to advanced levels.

- • Advanced Child Sex Offender Awareness seminars. **On-line child protection orientation seminar.**
 - *This seminar is designed to provide an introductory/orientation child protection overview for those people who have been screened and selected by their church leadership and passed a criminal history check, but not yet attended and completed the required state/church- based training requirements.*
 - *There may be times where seminars may be booked out, sometimes re scheduled or the participant is unable to attend the next available seminar. This on-line component serves as a bridging component and permits the individual to commence their ministry as a “helper” or “assistant” pending completion of the required state/church-based training.*

On-line child sex offender awareness orientation seminar.

- *This seminar focuses on the different types of child sex offenders and how they think, operate, groom, target and infiltrate churches.*
- *Although this level of training is embedded into the CPS/BCSA face to face training, it provides another avenue at an introductory level for church leadership teams such as Ministry teams, Elders, Board, Governance and Council members as well as parents.*
- *This seminar can also be utilised by those who have attended and completed accredited training outside of the CPS/BCSA training strategy.*

NOTE: On-line modules are additional support components only and DO NOT replace our face to face training standards/requirement.

- **Child Protection policy intensives**
- **Professional Standards policy intensives**
- **Person of Concern/known Child Sex Offender policy training**
